




PROGRESS TOWARDS OVERALL AIM OF THE PROJECT

Within 1 year time 663 students from different caste background (SC=432 + ST=35 + OBC=111 + open=34 + Christian=1 + Muslim=21 + NT=29) of Nagpur mix together without discrimination includes (male = 261, female= 402 in the age-group 12 to 18 yrs=342, 19 to 25 yrs=207, 25 to 35yrs=114) complete IT education, empowering 93 students to go on secure jobs in IT field and (259) students went on further professional academic qualifications at Diploma or Degree level thus they feel confident, equal, free, independent in caste dominated India.

Students working together in this way breaks down many caste barriers in a supported environment. Friendship, courage, independence, decision-making, determination, confidence, vision and professionalism are some of the many benefits students gained through the current Aryaloka project.

Women's need

In India the education and job prospects of girls and women is very low. Many girls do not complete their education, their families do not promote education for them and they are married off at a young age. They are not seen as potential contributors to the family financial situation. The Aryaloka Education Society has for the last 1 year (April-16 to March-16) attracted 61% women students. This has had a significant effect on these women helping them get computer and office related jobs, from simple data entry to administrators. This has shown their family and community that in this current age women can earn and contribute. It is changing the way women and societies see women. These women who attend Aryaloka are role models for their siblings and local community.

MAJOR ACHEIEVEMENTS

- We have successfully achieved annual target 663 students and open up the doors in IT field in 1 year April-March 2017.
- 93 students who receive job are in position to support themselves and their families. Most can earn enough to support their educational expenses.
- 259 students are carrying on further Academic Education hopefully sooner or later most will go various kinds of jobs and will become self sufficient in their life.
- Some are earning and learning together. Collect all the information through phone calls and personal communication.
- As per the record out of 400 students from BPL and disadvantage background 169 students completed and passed the exams 128 students are regular and preparing for exams. We did follow up for 300 students and we received the data that 93 students got jobs in computer related fields are as follows. 259 students are doing further higher academic education. Those failed and dropout 103 students are in the process of enrolling their names for re-exam.

CHANGES TO PLANNED ACTIVITIES

We haven't done any changes in planning activities.

We are only thinking to introduce some new courses like Abacus mathematics classes for children age between 10 to 18 yrs. We would like to continue to plan Summer Camp for children this year as well.

CHALLENGES


- New ERA (E-learning Revolution for All) introduced by MKCL for MSCIT course which was difficult to
 installed and use for learning purpose. It is mandatory for every student to attend every session at
 Centre because camera is fixed up by MKCL.
- Every day we use biometrics attendance system for students. It has created pressure on Teachers to take attendance every day. Otherwise their exam card will not generate.
- It's a challenge and risk if students get failure to attend every session leads to increase more dropouts in future. We will make sure that all the students will join ERA session every day.
- Demonetization of Currency affects our income. i.e. students and parents were disturbed and wasn't able to pay the fees. It has increased the dropouts. Now it's settling down and we are doing strong follow-up to reduce dropouts.

LESSONS LEARNED AND ADJUSTMENTS TO PROJECT

- We have decided to conduct exam at our centres so we have created a separate computer lab for exams in every ACE branch at Nagpur.
- In every ACE branch we are now conducting exams that have increased more work on Centre coordinators, teachers and system administrator.
- MSBTE (Maharashtra state board of technical education) impressed by seeing our infrastructure and computer lab with new PCs purchased by booster grant by The Karuna Trust. In this way we established our reputation with MSBTE.
- In future MSBTE insisted to convert exam centre from desktop to laptop (notebook computers) with 10 laptops.
- Having exam centre will increase more passing percentage.
- To increase the efficiency of the Aryaloka Computer Education branch Indora we have decided to appoint new qualified receptionist with high salary. So we have appointed Miss Sabina (done bachelor of engineering from Nagpur). She is really making difference in the working situation.

CASE STUDY

Student Case Study 1: Miss. Pushpa Tandan from Chattisgarh state.






She joined the course in Sept-2016 and done 6 months residential course includes (MS-CIT, DTP, Tally ERP 9, Hardware networking, English speaking and personality development class). She got information from Triratna's retreat centre name Satyalok at Chattisgarh through one general retreat where people speak about the Triratna's various projects and someone gave her information about Aryaloka Computer courses. Immediately she enrolled her name for residential course.

She is from Chattisgarh state from small village name Saranjgadh. She is clever students and though she is from very poor background she has completed her degree in BA(Batchelar of Arts). She is elder sister in the family. She has got two brothers and one sister. Her father quarrelled with her mother and started living separate with other lady. Her whole family situation was disturbed by her father's decision. Her mother wasn't educated so she use to work on others farm on daily wages. And father had stopped completely to support them that's why Pushpa had to work and started teaching children in one small private school in 2000/- Rs per month. But she was very much interested to learn computer courses for further development. Because of the participate in Triratna Dhamma retreat she got to know about Aryaloka and immediately joined residential course.

She done MSCIT course, Tally ERP 9 (accounting course), photoshop, Hardware Networking course and English speaking class by Mr. Mark from Sheffield Buddhist Centre and Miss Annabeth from London Buddhist Centre. It has increased her enormous confidence now she has got job in Raipur city, Chattisgarh as a computer operator and earning 5000/- Rs per month. I am sure after work experience she will get high salaried job. She would like to support her 2 brothers and sister in future. Hope her brother and sister will join IT courses at Aryaloka. She is continually searching new job as well. Hope she will get it.

Student Case Study 2: Miss Komal Raju Sarve



Komal Raju Sarve was 21 when she first approached Aryaloka Computer Education in Jan 2016, having heard about the course provision from a field worker, distributing course information leaflets to slum areas in the Pili Adi district off the Kamptee Road in Nagpur. Her family was in a desperate situation; her father had been made redundant from his full time work with a private company when the firm had collapsed 5 years ago. He had been unable to find any more work since that time and though his wife, Komal's mother had taken menial work in a school office, as an uneducated lady she was unable to earn enough to support the family on her monthly salary of 3000 Rupees. Komal has two brothers, both still in school, (10th Standard and BA First Year) and a sister who, suffering from a blood disease, is not only unable to work but has significant medical care costs. Komal herself was unemployed but very keen to begin working and help support her family. She approached Aryaloka and requested a visit, applying to study the four month MSC IT course soon after reading the information pamphlet. This diligent student participated enthusiastically in the full study programme as well as benefitting from the additional Personal Development and Self-Defence workshops offered to students. Such was her success that three of her friends have also joined the course since seeing how well she did under the guidance of the skilled and supportive teaching staff at the Institute. Since completing her studies, this conscientious 22 yearold has been able to find employment in a private office doing administration and other computer based tasks. She is no longer dependent on her parents, fully managing personal expenses on her own 3000 Rupee per month income, as well as improvement in their living standards, Komal is not content and knows they can achieve better. She has now resolved to continue her studies and will soon enrol on a course at Aryaloka where she will learn Tally; skills in this programme will enable her to find better paid work in an accounting firm and contribute still further to the wellbeing of her family, as well as improving her own prospects. Komal said she enjoyed the course a lot and the teachers were "very helpful".

I am married woman and left husband recently now I am living with my mom and son who is 3 yrs old. I have gone through lot of trouble in my life. I am the elder sister in my family and my mom is working in other houses washing pots and clothes. She earns very small amt of money and supports us. I left my husband because he was regular drinker and violent. He didn't work and not allow me to go out for work. So I decided to leave him immediately. Now I am leaving with my mom's house with my son and working in beauty Parlour in 2000/- Rs per month as a office cleaner. But how can I survive in 2000/- Rs. So I was very nervous and I didn't see any solution so decided to finish my life but one day the person later on I found that he is a field worker who comes to my house and gave me information about computer courses and the various opportunities at Aryaloka. So I joined the MSCIT course immediately. Now I am doing Tally accounting course as well. Before I used to go other computer Institutes but I didn't learn any IT skills because they didn't teach us properly and didn't give enough time on computers for practise. But at Aryaloka getting more practise on computer also the teaching was fabulous. Coming to every Sunday for personality development class is very helpful. I learned so many things from Aryaloka also I get encouragement from all teachers. I am really hopeful about my life. My son is 3 yrs old once he grown up then I will able to do official work in any office. And I hope and much confident that I will earn better salary sooner or later. Then I can help my son and my mom as well. I am very grateful to Aryaloka Education Society for starting such a wonderful project for poor people like me. I saw that many young women and men are benefitting from project. I look forward to send more students from poor background to Aryaloka. Best wishes for better future of Aryaloka.
